Rule Change Intent

Currently, there are no requirements that contact information be provided for horses stabled at competitions. This creates the opportunity for off-hours emergencies to occur without the possibility to contract the appropriate owner/trainer. This rule change would require that every stabled horse have a listed contact person in the event of an emergency.
